The DVC on the Internet

I thought that this might be a good time to revisit the topic of the DVC on the Internet. As this issue of *T-Talk* goes to press, work is underway to update and enhance our publicly accessible website. Lew Phillips has graciously taken on the job of webmaster and I'm sure it won't be too long before we start to see the fruits of his labour.

I know that some of us will need to make an adjustment to the "bookmarks" or "favorites" in our browsers in order to see the results. Do you access our current website at www.comcat.com/~zoomer? If so, you will not see the new site automatically when it is ready. For 2 years we have owned (maybe leased is a better word) the domain name www.dvcmg.com. This domain name is currently linked to the ~zoomer site, and will be adjusted when Lew brings up the new site. So point your browser to www.dvcmg.com, and the switch will be automatic!

The other Internet site devoted to the DVC is not really a website. It is an "email reflector" that is restricted to DVC members. The full description of the site is provided below, but the point is that if you send an email to it, it then sends the email to all participating members of the group. There are currently 44 members of the group, so if you send a question, dozens of DVC members will see it. There are other features of the site, such a file area where membership lists and events calendars may be downloaded, and a photo area where you can post the latest pictures from your digital camera. Here is the description:

This E-mail "reflector" is like a Bulletin Board, and it's EXCLUSIVELY for DVC MEMBERS!! You can post photos of you and your MG, details of your latest tech project or restoration, and ask questions of your fellow members.

It's a way for DVC members to keep in touch, share news, pass along MG tech and safety tips, ask questions, offer MG stuff for sale, seek help or needed parts, and enjoy DVC camaraderie in between meetings and events.

Members send E-mail to dvc-mg-club@yahoogroups.com which will appear on the Bulletin Board, to be seen by all members. Members can also upload text files to the "Files" section. This is a good place to post tech info you want to share. Same goes for photos of DVC events, you and your car, etc., to the "Photos" section. To be approved for membership, your name and e-mail must be shown on the latest DVC membership list maintained by the Membership Chairman, Chuck Goelz.

If you would like to become a member, point your browser to http://autos.groups.yahoo.com/group/dvc-mg-club/ and click on the button that says: "Join This Group". You will then be presented with the appropriate form to fill out to become a Yahoo Group member, and the group moderator, Jerry Keller, will be informed that you wish to become a member of this group. Jerry will admit you to the group after verifying your membership status.

MG QUICKIES

- 1. The MG factory was located in Abingdon-on-Thames from 1929 through 1980. The original factory and office buildings were purchased from the Pavlova Leather Company.
- 2. The "Abingdon Pillow" was the nickname given by MG factory personnel to the energy absorbing dashboard installed on all US sold MGB's and MGC's from 1968 1971.
- 3. The first American to purchase and import an MG was Henry Ford's son, Edsel. He purchased an M-type Midget on February 18th 1930 through Ford's London Office. It was then imported back to Dearborn, MI where he drove regularly for three years.
- 4. The last US specification MG was purchased by Henry Ford II and donated to the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn, MI. It was a 1980 black Limited Edition MGB.
- 5. MG's famous slogan, "Safety Fast!", was first used in 1929. It was devised by George Tuck, MG's Publicity Manager.

From Route 29/Route 73: From Zieglerville where Route 29 and Route 73 split, continue on Route 29 north for approx. 1.5 miles, turn right on Hendricks Road and then right on Cepp Road, we're the second house on the left.

Getting all the parts correctly in line, Can sometimes take a lot of time.


Pry hard o-ring seal out of the block, Be sure to replace or engine will knock.

Be negligent and forget just one seal, And you the owner will surely squeal.


As oil pumps out, squirtin, Your pocketbook really hurtin.
